this volume collects the critical prose of award winning writer anna frajlich the ghost of shakespeare takes its name from frajlich s essay on nobel prize laureate wiśława szymborska but informs her approach as a comparativist more generally as she considers the work of major polish writers of the twentieth century including zbigniew herbert cześław miłosz and bruno schulz frajlich s study of the roman theme in russian symbolism owes its origins to her stay in the eternal city the second stop on her exile from poland in 1969 the book concludes with autobiographical essays that describe her parents dramatic flight from poland at the outbreak of the war her own exile from poland in 1969 settling in new york city and building her career as a scholar and leading poet of her generation

in this first ever monograph on jacques derrida s toledo confession where he portrayed himself as sort of a marrano of the french catholic culture agata bielik robson shows derrida s marranismo to be a literary experiment of auto fiction

Bielik Robson shows that it penetrates deep into the very core of his late thinking, constantly drawing on the literary works of Kafka, Celan, Joyce, Cixous, and Valéry and throws a new light on his early works.
